Electronic Databases

The library currently subscribes to the following electronic databases, which provide a wide range of periodicals and books in full text.

1. Databases (EBSCO)

This database is considered one of the largest and most extensive databases for electronic periodicals in academic libraries and research centers in the world in all disciplines.

2. Scientific Researcher of CAS

It is the world's largest database in chemistry and retated sciences such as pharmacy, chemical engineering.

3. Emerald

Includes 310 refereed periodicals in foreign languages, this base covers topics related to economics, administrative sciences and electrical engineering.

4. Springer Link

It includes a group of electronic periodicals for various disciplines in full text ((full text

5. Scopus

A database that provides a comprehensive overview of world research for all disciplines as it is very useful for the research that the researcher wants to publish as it gives you complete information about the most internationally classified dectronic journals and the best internationally classified periodicals to publish research in them as a large group of faculty has been publishing their research

6. (Springer) Books

It includes more than 13,000 titles for the publisher (Springer) in various disciplines for the years of publication from 2005-2008.

- Circulation Instructions
- Bachelor's students (5) books as a maximum for a period not exceeding 14 days.
- Graduate students (10) books as a maximum for a period not exceeding 30 days.
- Faculty members (25) books for a period not exceeding 120 days.
- Administrative staff members (3) books as a maximum and for a period not exceeding 14 days.
- The return date is fixed on the last page of the book.
- The loan period is calculated from the first day of borrowing and ends with the beginning of the last day of borrowing.
- Borrowing is only done in the presence of the borrower in person and he must present his university card.
- The principle of fine shall be applied to overdue books at the rate of (250) fils per book for each day of delay.
- In the event of loss of the book, the borrower will be fined to pay twice the current price of the book or to provide an alternative original copy with the same publication data.
- Any borrower who causes the loss or distortion of the book or part thereof shall be punished in accordance with the instructions of the General Library Services.
- The library has the right to return any borrowed book before the end of its loan period and to refrain from lending any book if it requires placing it on the reservation shelf.

Library Tasks

- Acquisition of collections of various information containers, through purchase, subscriptions, targeting and exchange, and implementation at the local, Arab and international levels.
- 2. Organizing these collections with a series of technical procedures by recording, indexing, classifying and entering them on the computer and preparing indexes and searchlights for them, according to the latest international principles and standards that the library can apply, as well as preservation procedures through binding and restoration.
- Providing information services such as references, guidance, reservation, secondinent and photography, and providing an environment for research and reading.
- Encouraging the definition of Jordanian intellectual production, especially the production of university employees, and introducing it through the acquisition of copies of it and donating them or exchanging them with universities and other cultural institutions in Jordan and abroad.
- 5. Training and development of the staff apparatus.
- Developing the skills of accessing information among students and researchers.
- Providing technical and information services to the local community.
- 8. Cooperation and exchange of information to develop cadres and services locally, especially with university libraries, through the library's membership in the Jordanian Library and Information Association, and in the Arab world with direct relations, through the Association of Universities Arab and the Arab League Educational, Cultural and Scientific Organization, and internationally in direct relations and through the library's membership in the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions.
