Brief description

This course introduces first-year nursing students to the foundations of professional nursing and the principles of therapeutic communication. Topics include the history and values of nursing, professional roles and responsibilities, ethics, legal aspects, advocacy, and documentation. Students will develop essential communication skills with patients, families, and healthcare teams, with attention to cultural diversity, interprofessional collaboration, and self-care. The course also covers infection control, health promotion, and an introduction to health informatics and artificial intelligence in nursing practice.
