#### **Brief description**

This course is designed to introduce the beginning-nursing students to the field of nursing practice. Focus is on the application of nursing concepts and skills related to caring in the hospital setting. Clinical experience focuses on the basic care of the adult client with health alteration problems. The nursing process and critical thinking are utilized as a framework to identify and provide nursing care. Emphasis is placed on developing skills needed to assess, implement and monitor selected nursing interventions and technologies. Therapeutic communication, legal and ethical issues, professional commitment are also emphasized. Clinical areas include medical ward-surgical ward-hematology ward-endoscopy unit- operation room.
