Brief course description

The objective of this course is to advance the students' skills in the comprehension of standard college English with focus on the sentence as the basic unit of understanding. The course proceeds from a concentrated review of basic skills, essential grammatical rules, and standard vocabulary acquired by students in their pre-college studies to a comprehensive analytical study of the essential syntactic and semantic components of the various types of English sentences as found in paragraphs and passages. A combination of extensive exercises and selected comprehension passages are recommended to develop the students' skills.
