Abstract

In this study is concerned of interpretive function concept, means of exercising the Tribunal's function, and the arguments strength of the Constitutional Court decisions, a comparative study (Egypt, Kuwait, Jordan), The study used the comparative approach taken from the experiences of countries as a basis for evaluating the Jordanian experience in constitutional texts interpretation, without neglecting to mention the courts decisions of the countries of study.

It is found that the establishment of the Constitutional Court in Jordan is considered a gain because its task is to control the constitutionality of laws as a specialized court, to ensure respect for the Constitution and its provisions, and ensure that it is applied properly, thus contributing to the establishment of constitutional rules that ensure the protection of the rights of individuals and the inviolability of their freedoms.

It is concluded with several recommendations such as the need to form Constitutional Court members to exercise Constitution provisions the interpretation in such a way as to ensure the existence of members of the Government, the National Assembly Council and other neutral technical bodies, and the need to those requesting interpretation to attend court sessions, Because this will impact the text interpretation speed or their question about any inquiries by the Court members.
