Summary of the study

This study dealt with "the criminal responsibility of the new coronavirus infection vector (Covid-19) to show the extent to which the criminal responsibility of the vector of infection (CORONA) in the Jordanian legislation, where this study tried to answer a set of questions that formed the axes of the study. The answers of these questions were discussed in its main chapters, since this virus is considered as one of the most dangerous viruses during this period due to its abuse of human safety and right of health, particularly, with no actual and certified vaccine to prevent it.

This study addressed the penal responsibility for the transmission of Covid to third parties, through explaining the medical and the legal infection concept, indicating the position of WHO and health legislation on infection and the legal nature of transporting and then identifying the carrier and his responsibility.

The study was therefore subject to the provisions of criminal responsibility for the transmission of Corona Virus to others in its intended and unintended form, the extent to which the general rules are applied to the arising crimes from its transmission, and indicating the criminal responsibility in terms of proving and preventing it.

In conclusion, the study concluded a series of results and recommendations, the most important of which is the lack of punitive texts that are contained in the Jordanian Public Health Law, and as a result of that the contained texts in the Penal Code are applied, which makes it difficult to be applied due to the difficulty of criminal adaptation to the transmission of the virus infection to others. All of that was encouraged to

suggest a number of recommendations that we hope will be accepted by the Jordanian legislator and judiciary.
